

Spectators will:

- Let the coaches do the coaching.
- Let the players do the playing.
- Let the officials manage gameplay.
- Respect all players, coaches, spectators, and program management and staff.
- Promote and encourage good sportsmanship by demonstrating positive support for players, coaches, officials, and spectators. (*i.e., cheering!*)
- Treat everyone with respect, regardless of race, color, age, sex, religion national origin, disability, or skill level.
- NOT confront, taunt, mock, complain about officials or calls made during any game.
-If you have any critical concerns about a call made or regarding the conduct of an official, please contact the respective Recreation Program Coordinator AFTER the game.
- Help their family members and other fans abide by the rules and expectations of this Spectator Code of Conduct.

Spectators additionally understand and agree that:

- Abuse or harassment (physical or verbal), including bullying, towards any players, volunteers, coaches, officials, spectators, or program employees in any form will not be tolerated.
- Physical altercations (hitting, pushing, touching, “getting in the face of”) or verbal altercations (threatening, making fun of, calling names, cursing, arguing) are strictly prohibited.

Non-Compliance

Those that do not comply with all standards and expectations as previously described, including spectators, players and spectators, are subject to the following:

Individuals:

- 1st in-game infraction by spectator results in a simple verbal warning from official.
- 2nd in-game infraction by same spectator results in the spectator and their family being removed from the park.
 - Game will be delayed, suspended, or canceled, as necessary, and without makeup, in the event of non-compliance in leaving the park.
 - After being asked to leave a game, spectator will receive a written notice from league administration, with a warning that if they are asked to leave at any future point in that same season, they and their family will be suspended for the rest of that season.
- In the event of a second game dismissal, the spectator will receive a written notice of the season's suspension. Additionally, league management will review the previous incidents as necessary, and determine whether or not spectator and their participants/family members will be welcome to participate in future youth programs.

Entire Supporter Group:

- Should the above Individual sequence happen twice in a single game with the same team's sideline, the entire sideline of fans and spectators must vacate the premises.
 - Game will be delayed, suspended, or canceled, as necessary, and without makeup, in the event of non-compliance in leaving the park.
 - The entire team will receive a written notice from league administration, with a warning that if the entire sideline is cleared again in any game during the remainder of that season, all spectators and fans of that team will be suspended for the rest of the season.
- In the event the sideline is cleared for a second time, at any point after the first incident, the team will receive written notice that all fans and spectators are suspended for the rest of the season.
